

Quick definitions

- Jew: someone of Jewish religion, from any country and ethnicity (European, African, Latin American, Asian; white, black, Asian, Latino); parents are Jewish or person converted to Judaism
- Israeli: citizen of Israel; any religion Jewish, Muslim, Christian, Druze, etc.; any ethnicity – Arab, European, African, etc. Note: 20% of Israelis are Arabs.
- Arab in Israel / Israeli-Arab refers to ethnic residents from region, who may be Muslims or Christian

Note, there are also Arab Jews – 800,000 were expelled from or forced to leave Egypt, Syria, Iraq, Yemen, Libya, Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, and Libya from 1948 through 1950s and 1960s

Maccabi's survey

- Maccabi is one of 4 main HMOs in Israel, 2.5M members
- Conducted 2 surveys:
 - □ November 2023
 - □ general population
 - 501 random people asked about life before war vs. during war
 - **Ages 20-75**
 - Adjusted for HMO, age, sex and geographic region

- □ November-December 2023
- □ 245 families of hostages+ volunteers
- □ Ages 18-75
- □ Asked about life before war vs. during war



How would you rate your health condition in general?



Massacre on 7.10.23



- biggest slaughter of Jews since Holocaust
- 1200 people killed
- massacre:
 - elderly killed, people burned, baby cut out of mother's uterus, children decapitated
 - women raped so bad hips dislocated
 - houses burned
- took 253 people hostage, age 9 months to 85 years
- most hostages are <u>civilians</u>

General public saw these types of photos in media, shared by friends – so population traumatized by what happened

War and threats to life

Sons and daughters fighting in Gaza, now also at northern border

Everyone knows someone who is deployed – friend, neighbor, friend's neighbor, neighbor's friend

 Missiles regularly shot from Gaza into Israel (still!), Lebanon, Iran, Houthis in Yemen

Increased use of mental health • services, 2023

- increase ~30% in medical diagnosis for depression and anxiety
- increase ~90% in purchase of sedatives without prescription in the "Maccabi Pharm" chain of pharmacies
- No change in % taking medication to treat depression or anxiety, but of those who took medication before and during the war, 27% increased the dose or changed medications
- 18% of respondents said need to receive help from mental health professionals due to war




Sleep quality

Massacre survivors and evacuees





Massacre survivors, evacuated communities

- Massacre survivors Nova music festival, Kibbutz Be'eri, Kibbutz Kfar Aza, etc.
- 125,000 residents of towns in south evacuated to hotels further north due to villages destroyed in massacre + rockets from Gaza
 - 27,000 still in hotels

Maccabi Healthcare Services survey of evacuees: (will be published soon!)

- 1/3 of war's evacuees reported change in health condition for the worse
- 45% increase in use of medications to treat depression or anxiety
- 45% need mental help from a professional but 1/5 haven't sought help
- Less healthy behaviors stopped exercising, smoke more/started to smoke again, sleep less





Services to evacuated populations

- People evacuated to Dead Sea tourist area, no medical services nearby (middle of Negev desert)
- Had to find solutions trucks for gynecology exams & mammograms; medical consultations by video; clinics on weekends – doctors, nurses, others volunteer for free



- Mental health government services, HMO services, volunteers; support by phone and video
- Mental health hotlines expanded services





Hostages and released hostages







- Hamas took 253 people hostage
 - age 9 months to 85 years, including 30 children under 16
 - Jews, Muslims/Arabs, others
 - Israelis as well as non-Israelis Thai and Filipino guest workers, people from US, Tanzania, Nepal
- 109 hostages released by Hamas, 3 rescued by IDF
- Still 95 hostages believed alive (old people, ill people) + 37 bodies
- Babies still among the hostages
- Hostages are drugged, raped, tortured physically and psychologically

Released hostages and mental health

Experiences from released captives:

- Hamas told them: 'Israel doesn't care about you', family members dead
- "We were constantly kept in apartments with terrorists who threatened that we will die in Gaza, and that our families don't care about us."
- Children separated from families, shown "brutal videos", drugged (ketamine, benzodiazepines)
- Several released hostages kept in total darkness for 4+ days. "They became psychotic, they had hallucinations."
- Some former hostages continue to experience dissociative states: "One minute they know that they are here at Ichilov Medical Center, and the next they think they are back with Hamas."





Protocols for care of released hostages: mental health focus

Health Ministry's February 2024 protocols (updated from Nov 2023):

- updated per consultations with hospitals, community health systems, acute sexual abuse response teams, police and IDF
- recommended minimum of four-day stays in hospitals' special areas for returned hostages, to allow needed medical and mental care; constant set of healthcare professionals
- each returned hostage assigned nurse and social worker; treatment plan includes transition to community
- medical staff at the hospitals underwent additional training on treating cases of sexual abuse, war crimes and torture in captivity

Treating child hostages

- Trained Israeli therapists working with child hostages body work / trauma relief techniques
- Provided trainings at Metiv and Hadassah
- Trauma, PTSD
- Children can't express verbally, need body movement
- Supporting traumatized therapists

The flagship of Hadassah, the Women's Zionist Organization of America, the two hospitals have 1,000 beds, 31 operating theaters, nine specially oriented intensive care units and five schools of allied medical professions, owned and operated in collaboration with the Hebrew University.

"My wife and daughter [Sharon and Noam] were released from captivity [on November 25], but I am still suffering physically and emotionally. I have lost eight kilos (17 pounds). I'm smoking more than in the past and am taking more drugs. I have ongoing sleep problems and am unable to work."

Women





Increase in need among women

- 84% of the female members of the families of the abductees feel they need mental assistance from professional (vs. 23% of general population)
 - About 2/3 receive assistance
- Daughters of kidnapped families have 2x increase in use of drugs to treat depression or anxiety (from 8% to 19%)


Special Forces Paramedic's testimony:

"I entered a home...While we're looking for injured people, civilians to rescue...terrorists are still holding houses...

I opened with my team one of the rooms of that house and I see two girls lying, one on a bed, one on the floor...the girl, a 14, 15 years old teenager...she is lying on her stomach, her pants are pulled down...her legs spread out wide open, and there are remains of sperm on her back.

Silence from feminist groups








Arab-Israeli experience

Thoughts about where to emigrate to live most safely as a Jew *Testimonies from Jews in Switzerland about their mental health since 7 October*

Feeling unprepared to **defend our children**

Fear for the future (especially for safety of my children, for example in public school and environment)

Seeing the rapes and violence against women has changed the approach to the body Afraid of people speaking Arabic near me

What happened is completely unbearable. Mentally, I have to navigate around

black holes. As a philosophically inclined person I struggle with the phenomena dead, pain, and hate...In the past I felt guilty, today I feel sad. It's difficult to keep some balance.





Testimony from Swiss therapist who treats Jewish patients

Since October 7th of last year, I have observed changes in the mental and emotional well-being of Israeli and Jewish clients. Initially, they expressed a **strong need to grieve and process the pain** and sadness about the attack and consecutive events.

As time has passed and tensions in the region have escalated alongside international pressures, I have noticed a shift in the themes they bring up during our sessions. They have begun to exhibit **heightened emotional distress**, and to present an **increase in signs of anxiety and depression**.

My perception is that their **fear** is becoming more eminent, resulting in a significant increase in **stress and anxiety**. The focus during our sessions has been often their perceived **sense of insecurity in their daily lives in Switzerland, including fear of harassment in public spaces** based on reports from other places. Some clients have also started expressing **existential fears about the future**, emphasizing the necessity to address their fundamental needs for security and emotional stability.





Trauma for Jews outside of Israel

- Don't feel safe, lost security
- Invokes generational memories of Holocaust
- Preparing for more to come
- Modern anti-Semitism
- Missing empathy for Jews





Rejection of facts and logic

- Facts:
 - Hamas recorded massacre on GoPro cams, uploaded videos to Telegram (chat platform)
 - Dead, mutilated bodies in Israel all show massacre against civilians
- Hamas document "Our Narrative: Operation Al-Aqsa Flood" (Jan 2024) says Hamas didn't harm civilians:

"AI-Qassam Brigades fighters...avoid[ed] harm to civilians, especially children, women, and elderly people."

Pro-Palestinian supporters worldwide believe such lies





the way forward in Israel: putting people at the center

Remember: "Israelis" means Jews, Arabs, Muslims, Druze, Bedouins, immigrants from Ethiopia, Ukraine, Russia, etc.





Mental health - reinventing selves

Systemic changes country-wide:

- Mental health services transferred in 2015 from government to HMOs, but HMOs still building infrastructure
- Government, organizations spending funds to open clinics, build new clinics, train psychiatrists, psychologists, nurses, art therapists, etc.
- Building system that didn't exist before war
- Will benefit Israelis post-war





Maccabi HMO – increasing services

- Call high-need people weekly, connect them with care
- App to call doctors/video calls
- Finding new ways to reach people
- All 4 major HMOs offered 3 free mental health "visits" by phone or online







- Building new centers to treat trauma
- First time country undergoes trauma AND getting care (vs. Cambodia, Rwanda, etc. trauma but no care)
- Trying to prevent trans-generational trauma
- Building pool of therapists to treat trauma





Training more professionals

NATAL's Multidisciplinary Center for Trauma Studies

- training hundreds of trauma therapists in Israel and globally
- launched specialized trauma therapy courses

Metiv - Training for mental-health professionals

- contacted by more than 2,500 psychologists and social workers
- per request by Ministry of Health and the Council of Psychologists created three-session course in psychological first response; launched course within two weeks after attacks and trained 1,200 psychologists.
- offer condensed versions of trauma therapy trainings for mental-health professionals
- provide supervision for therapists unaccustomed to treating trauma



Creativity to meet needs

- Metiv: 3 MH professionals stay in hotel with 1,500 elderly & vulnerable people evacuated from Sderot (very close to Gazan rockets)
 - provide individual treatment
 - provide workshops for hotel staff & volunteers on dealing with prolonged stress



- trauma-informed play spaces in other hotels with evacuees
- Peace of Mind emotional support hotline for soldiers and veterans
- At request of IDF running short-term interventions for groups
- Enosh: Mobile mental health and psychosocial support services (MHPSS) units access to essential services for those impacted by crisis

Mission: To provide quality and professional community-based mental health services for people with psychosocial disabilities and to support their families To increase awareness around mental health and fight society's stigmas towards people with psychosocial disabilities To promote the rights of people with psychosocial disabilities and their family members







- Government's January 2024 budget added funds for mental health
- Government's plan for rebuilding southern region destroyed by massacre – includes mental health clinics for residents, especially children, affected by Hamas hostilities
- Need more funding!





Why this is relevant for you





Jews in your countries are suffering

 Jews deserve support from public health, health and mental health systems, as well as civil society





Jews made to feel as "other"

- Silence from world organizations call for ceasefire but not for freeing of hostages
- Groups that fight hate (against LGBTQ+, Muslims, non-white) don't fight hate of Jews
- Civil society is silent
- Attacking Zionism = attacking Jews since most Jews support existence of Israel - i.e., are Zionists (even if don't agree with all Israeli policies)

Crimes against humanity

- Rape as weapon of war, crimes against women, mutilated genitals of men & women
- Using children as weapons
- Hiding behind civilians, weaponizing civilians

Long-term effects of massacre and war

Hamas war sparks a mental health crisis of Israeli generational trauma "Second generation" trauma in Israel was evidenced by the children of Holocaust survivors and the generation after the Yom Kippur War [in 1973]. The fallout from October 7 may be even worse.
